Customer must be:

- Adults 18 or older
- Authorized to work in the US
- If male and born after 12/31/1959 compliant with military selective service requirements
- Unemployed and unable to find unsubsidized employment that leads to self-sufficiency
- Employed and unable to obtain or maintain employment that allows self-sufficiency
- Information for youth programs available upon request

The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014 provides the framework for a unique workforce preparation and employment system designed to meet both the needs of the job seekers and those who want to further their careers or education. The most important aspect of the Act is its focus on meeting the needs of local businesses for skilled workers and the training, education, and employment needs of the individuals.

Applying for WIOA funds is easy

Application Procedures

1. Attend Orientation.
2. Gather and/or complete required documents.
3. Complete Customer Intent Form.
4. Schedule an appointment for assessments.
5. Your Career Specialist will review your documents for approval.

Required Documents For All Applicants

- Birth certificate
- Social Security card, original-signed card
- Valid IL driver's license, state ID, valid photo ID, or US passport
- High school transcript, GED certificate, college diploma
- Proof of financial aid (including Pell Grants/ISAAC/MAP Grant/student loan/work study/scholarships)
- Proof of current address
- Verification of income
- Verification of dislocated worker status

Required Documents (if applicable)

- Males born after 12/31/1959
 - o Selective Service registration
- Veteran
 - o DD-214
- Disabled
 - o Proof of any disability (learning, physical, etc.)
- Former/Current College Student/Graduate
 - o Unofficial copy of college transcript(s) from all institutions attended.
- Parent request for child assistance (if available):
 - o Copies of birth certificates for all children under 6 years of age.
 - o Copy of CHAS! Award/Denial letter
